

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

When I became IALE President at our World Congress in July 2019, I had visions of seeing the world, visiting chapters in India, Japan, Africa, Iran, Europe, and more!

Things didn't turn out that way and I didn't attend another IALE meeting until March 2023. Likely this has been the same for most of us. In addition to the pandemic, war, economic disruption, and climate change have also created barriers to our global community. And IALE, like many other academic societies, suffered as a result. Regional meetings drive our membership and without the opportunity to meet in person, memberships lapsed, and people become disengaged. Virtual meetings initially seemed like a solution but their effectiveness declined over time. Several chapters went into hibernation and many of our founding members retired, passed away, or left our society.

We remain, nonetheless, on a strong, stable footing. Regular chapter meetings started in earnest in 2023 and will continue with our World Congress in July (with over 500 in attendance, in person). Our finances are strong. Over the past four years, we worked on updating many of our processes (e.g., new membership database, improved communications, better publishing agreements, a new website) and I'm proud of what the IALE Executive Committee accomplished.

Now we are at a crossroads. We need to rebuild our chapters, our global community, and our passion for landscape ecology. We need to do so because the world has never needed landscape ecologists more. We develop the knowledge and tools and collaborations that will be essential to building a resilient future for people and places everywhere. Much has been made about the majority of the world's population living in urban areas, but

landscapes will always be the birthplace of cultures, the sources of ecosystem services, and the foundation of our humanity. As the world transitions into a new era of relentless uncertainty and change, we have the opportunity to be the midwife to a better future.

How do we do so?

- Promote global collaborations: We are stronger through our collective efforts. No one person or chapter or region has a monopoly on brilliant ideas and novel perspectives. Consider joining one of our many cross-chapter Working Groups - or start a new one! In particular, reach out to colleagues in countries in crisis. Excellence thrives even where governments fail to meet our high standards.
- And engage locally: Even as we develop our global network, we need to engage with the local people and places who will be affected by our science. John Wiens described landscape ecology as the bridge between science and action. That bridge has to include and represent the people at the receiving end of the action! Resilient and sustainable communities are built from the ground up and not from the academic literature.
- Share your passion for landscape ecology: When and why did you become invested? For me, I wanted to make a difference in the world, using science as a tool for improving the lives of people while improving our capacity to support other species. When I discovered landscape ecology in the late 90s, I knew this was the approach I had to take. Only later did I discover the amazing community of people who shared that same vision.
- Promote our future leaders: the future is among us, represented by our students and new colleagues. It



is time for us to 'pass the torch' to the next generation. Future leaders are born in committees - invite them to join us!

Be generous, open, and respectful.
 Many of us enjoy unique circumstances
 not available to all. IALE has a reputation for supporting students
 and less resourced scholars. Let's keep that spirit alive!

In closing, I want to acknowledge all the people who have made this less-traveled presidential term a success: our members old and new - who continue to support our vision for globally connected and effective science; my delightful colleagues on the Executive Committee; the many chapter leaders who have kept the wheels turning, despite the difficulties; and those many leaders who came before and gifted us a strong and vibrant global community. I'll continue to remain an engaged and passionate member (and Past President for the next four years) and I hope to see you, in person, at a meeting somewhere besides cyberspace!


